



The 1986 World Series and the Iconic Game 6



The 2016 NLCS was a roller coaster of emotions for Mets fans. They faced the Chicago Cubs, a team on a historic run.



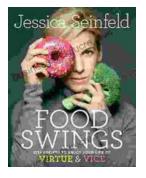
